7	An Act relating to conversion of certain vehicles to compressed natural gas; enacting the County Fleet
8	Vehicle Compressed Natural Gas Conversion Funding Act of 2014; creating the County Fleet Vehicle Compressed
9	Natural Gas Conversion Cost Revolving Fund; providing for apportionment of revenues to fund; stating
10	purposes; prescribing method for expenditure of funds; providing for management and control by
11	circuit engineering districts; providing for separation of fund into accounts; amending 68 O.S.
12	2011, Section 1004, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 205, O.S.L. 2012 (68 O.S. Supp. 2013, Section
13	1004), which relates to the apportionment of gross production tax revenues; modifying apportionment to
14	General Revenue Fund of State Treasury; providing for apportionment of revenues to the County Fleet Vehicle
15	Compressed Natural Gas Conversion Cost Revolving Fund; providing for codification; providing an
16	effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
20	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
21	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1451 of Title 19, unless there
22	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
23	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "County Fleet
24	Vehicle Compressed Natural Gas Conversion Funding Act of 2014".

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1452 of Title 19, unless there
 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund 5 for the circuit engineering districts of the State of Oklahoma to be designated the "County Fleet Vehicle Compressed Natural Gas 6 7 Conversion Cost Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of 8 9 all monies received by the fund from the apportionment of gross 10 production tax revenues as provided in Section 1004 of Title 68 of 11 the Oklahoma Statutes. All monies accruing to the credit of said 12 fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the 13 circuit engineering districts for the purpose of offsetting the 14 costs associated with converting fleet vehicles to compressed 15 natural gas. Expenditures from said fund shall be made upon 16 warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as 17 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and 18 Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1453 of Title 19, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The circuit engineering districts shall make available to
 each county an equal share of the total funds in the County Fleet
 Vehicle Compressed Natural Gas Conversion Cost Revolving Fund. The

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1 total amount of the balance of the Fund shall be divided by seventy-2 seven (77) and each county shall have an account within the Fund 3 equal to such amount.

B. The circuit engineering districts shall have the authority
to use the monies in the Fund in order to pay costs for the
conversion of the existing county fleet vehicles to compressed
natural gas.

8 C. The Fund shall only be used for costs related to conversion 9 of county fleet vehicles and shall not be used for any other 10 purpose.

11SECTION 4.AMENDATORY68 O.S. 2011, Section 1004, as12last amended by Section 1, Chapter 205, O.S.L. 2012 (68 O.S. Supp.132013, Section 1004), is amended to read as follows:

Section 1004. A. Beginning July 1, 2002 2014, the gross production tax provided for in Section 1001 of this title is hereby levied and shall be collected and apportioned as follows:

For all monies collected from the tax levied on asphalt or
 ores bearing uranium, lead, zinc, jack, gold, silver or copper:

12 shall be allocated to each county as provided for in 13 subparagraph b of this paragraph and shall be 14 apportioned, on an average daily attendance per capita 15 distribution basis, as certified by the State 16 Superintendent of Public Instruction to the school 17 districts of the county where such pupils attend 18 school regardless of residence of such pupil, provided 19 the school district makes an ad valorem tax levy of 20 fifteen (15) mills for the current year and maintains 21 twelve (12) years of instruction;

For all monies collected from the tax levied on oil at a tax 12 rate of seven percent (7%) pursuant to the provisions of subsection B of Section 1001 of this title: 13 14 twenty-five and seventy-two one-hundredths percent a. 15 (25.72%) shall be paid to the State Treasurer to be 16 placed in the Common Education Technology Revolving 17 Fund created in Section 34.90 of Title 62 of the 18 Oklahoma Statutes, 19 b. twenty-five and seventy-two one-hundredths percent 20 (25.72%) shall be paid to the State Treasurer to be 21 placed in the Higher Education Capital Revolving Fund 22 created in Section 34.91 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma 23 Statutes, 24

- c. twenty-five and seventy-two one-hundredths percent (25.72%) shall be paid to the State Treasurer to be placed in the Oklahoma Student Aid Revolving Fund created in Section 34.92 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma Statutes,
- d. three and seven hundred forty-five one-thousandths 6 percent (3.745%) shall be distributed to the various 7 counties of the state for deposit into the County 8 9 Bridge and Road Improvement Fund of each county based 10 on a formula developed by the Department of 11 Transportation and approved by the Department of 12 Transportation County Advisory Board created pursuant 13 to Section 302.1 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes 14 to be used for the purposes set forth in the County 15 Bridge and Road Improvement Act. The formula shall be 16 similar to the formula currently used for the 17 distribution of monies in the County Bridge Program 18 funds, but shall also take into consideration the 19 effect of the terrain and traffic volume as related to 20 county road improvement and maintenance costs, 21 four and twenty-eight one-hundredths percent (4.28%) e. 22 shall be paid to the State Treasurer to be apportioned 23 to:

- f. seven and fourteen one-hundredths percent (7.14%) of
  the sum collected from oil shall be paid to the

various county treasurers, to be credited to the County Highway Fund as follows: Each county shall receive a proportionate share of the funds available based upon the proportion of the total value of production from such county in the corresponding month of the preceding year,

7 seven and fourteen one-hundredths percent (7.14%) g. shall be allocated to each county as provided in 8 9 subparagraph f of this paragraph and shall be 10 apportioned, on an average daily attendance per capita 11 distribution basis, as certified by the State 12 Superintendent of Public Instruction, to the school 13 districts of the county where such pupils attend 14 school regardless of residence of such pupil, provided 15 the school district makes an ad valorem tax levy of 16 fifteen (15) mills for the current year and maintains 17 twelve (12) years of instruction, and 18 h. five hundred thirty-five one-thousandths percent 19 (0.535%) of the levy shall be transmitted by the 20 Oklahoma Tax Commission to the Statewide Circuit 21 Engineering District Revolving Fund as created in 22 Section 687.2 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes; 23

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- For all monies collected from the tax levied on oil at a tax
   rate of four percent (4%) pursuant to the provisions of subsection B
   of Section 1001 of this title:
- a. twenty-two and one-half percent (22.5%) shall be paid
  to the State Treasurer to be placed in the Common
  Education Technology Revolving Fund created in Section
  34.90 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma Statutes,
- b. twenty-two and one-half percent (22.5%) shall be paid
  b. twenty-two and one-half percent (22.5%) shall be paid
  to the State Treasurer to be placed in the Higher
  Education Capital Revolving Fund created in Section
  34.91 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma Statutes,
- 12 c. twenty-two and one-half percent (22.5%) shall be paid
  13 to the State Treasurer to be placed in the Oklahoma
  14 Student Aid Revolving Fund created in Section 34.92 of
  15 Title 62 of the Oklahoma Statutes,
- 16 d. three and twenty-eight one-hundredths percent (3.28%) 17 shall be distributed to the various counties of the 18 state for deposit into the County Bridge and Road 19 Improvement Fund of each county based on a formula 20 developed by the Department of Transportation and 21 approved by the Department of Transportation County 22 Advisory Board created pursuant to Section 302.1 of 23 Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes to be used for the 24 purposes set forth in the County Bridge and Road

Improvement Act. The formula shall be similar to the formula currently used for the distribution of monies in the County Bridge Program funds, but shall also take into consideration the effect of the terrain and traffic volume as related to county road improvement and maintenance costs,

- e. three and seventy-five one-hundredths percent (3.75%) shall be paid to the State Treasurer to be apportioned to:

- f. twelve and one-half percent (12.5%) of the sum 8 9 collected from oil shall be paid to the various county 10 treasurers, to be credited to the County Highway Fund 11 Each county shall receive a proportionate as follows: 12 share of the funds available based upon the proportion 13 of the total value of production from such county in 14 the corresponding month of the preceding year, 15 twelve and one-half percent (12.5%) shall be allocated q. 16 to each county as provided in subparagraph f of this 17 paragraph and shall be apportioned on an average daily 18 attendance per capita distribution basis, as certified 19 by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction, to 20 the school districts of the county where such pupils 21 attend school regardless of residence of such pupil, 22 provided the school district makes an ad valorem tax 23 levy of fifteen (15) mills for the current year and 24 maintains twelve (12) years of instruction, and

For all monies collected from the tax levied on oil at a tax
rate of one percent (1%) pursuant to the provisions of subsection B
of Section 1001 of this title:

- 9 a. fifty percent (50%) of the sum collected shall be paid
  10 to the various county treasurers, to be credited to
  11 the County Highway Fund as follows: Each county shall
  12 receive a proportionate share of the funds available
  13 based upon the proportion of the total value of
  14 production from such county in the corresponding month
  15 of the preceding year, and
- 16 fifty percent (50%) shall be allocated to each county b. 17 as provided for in subparagraph a of this paragraph 18 and shall be apportioned on an average daily 19 attendance per capita distribution basis, as certified 20 by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction, to 21 the school districts of the county where such pupils 22 attend school regardless of residence of such pupil, 23 provided the school district makes an ad valorem tax
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levy of fifteen (15) mills for the current year and maintains twelve (12) years of instruction.

3 B. Provided, notwithstanding any other provision of this 4 section, the total amounts deposited to the Common Education 5 Technology Revolving Fund, the Higher Education Capital Revolving Fund, the Oklahoma Student Aid Revolving Fund, the Rural Economic 6 7 Action Plan Water Projects Fund, the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department Capital Expenditure Revolving Fund, the Oklahoma 8 9 Conservation Commission Infrastructure Revolving Fund and the 10 Community Water Infrastructure Development Revolving Fund pursuant 11 to paragraphs 5 and 6 of subsection A of this section shall not 12 exceed One Hundred Fifty Million Dollars (\$150,000,000.00) in any 13 fiscal year. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, all 14 sums in excess of One Hundred Fifty Million Dollars 15 (\$150,000,000.00) in any fiscal year which would otherwise be 16 deposited in such funds shall be apportioned by the Oklahoma Tax 17 Commission to the General Revenue Fund of the state. Provided, 18 amounts which would otherwise be apportioned by the Oklahoma Tax 19 Commission to the General Revenue Fund for the fiscal year ending on 20 June 30, 2012, pursuant to this subsection, shall be apportioned as 21 follows:

Thirty-seven Million Six Hundred Thousand Dollars
 (\$37,600,000.00) to the State Department of Education disbursing
 fund authorized by the Office of State Finance pursuant to the

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provisions of Section 34.48 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma Statutes, to be used for the purpose of funding the certified employee and support personnel health benefit allowance;

4 2. Fourteen Million Eight Hundred Forty-five Thousand Seven 5 Hundred Dollars (\$14,845,700.00) to the State Department of Education disbursing fund authorized by the Office of State Finance 6 7 pursuant to the provisions of Section 34.48 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma Statutes, to be used for the purpose of providing bonuses 8 9 to teachers who have achieved National Board certification, to 10 school psychologists who have been designated as Nationally 11 Certified School Psychologists by the National School Psychology 12 Certification Board, and to speech-language pathologists and 13 audiologists who hold a Certificate of Clinical Competence awarded 14 by the American Speech-Language Hearing Association, pursuant to the 15 Education Leadership Oklahoma Act;

16 3. Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) to the Department of 17 Public Safety Patrol Academy Revolving Fund created in Section 2-146 18 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

4. One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) to the Chief Medical
Examiner Revolving Fund created in Section 954 of Title 63 of the
Oklahoma Statutes;

5. Thirty-four Million One Hundred Forty-five Thousand Seven Hundred Six Dollars (\$34,145,706.00) to the State Emergency Fund created in Section 139.42 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

1	6. All funds except those deposited pursuant to the provisions
2	of paragraphs 1 through 5 of this subsection to the General Revenue
3	Fund.
4	SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2014.
5	SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
6	of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
7	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
8	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
